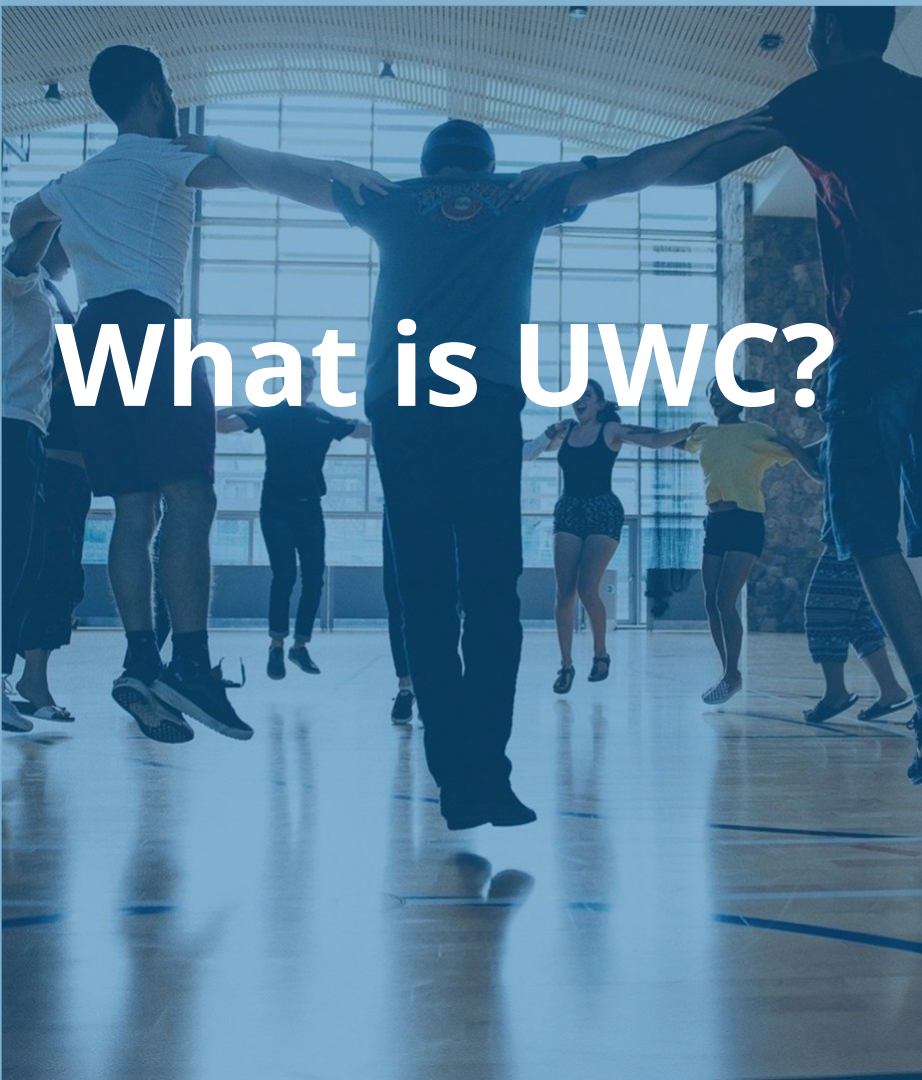

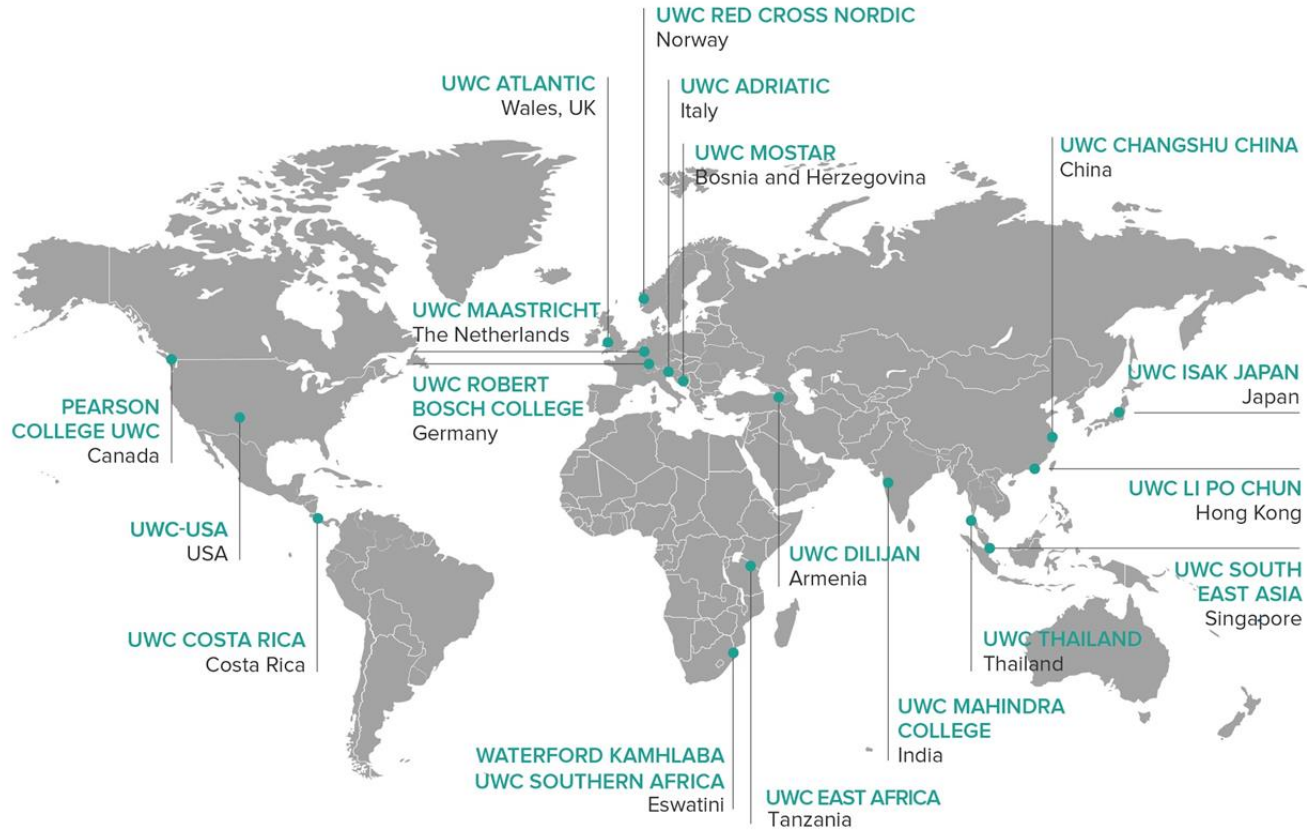
UWC core values

The International Baccalaureate

IB Diploma students choose 6 courses, one from each of the following six subject areas:


1. Studies in Language and Literature
2. Language Acquisition
3. Individuals and Societies
4. Sciences
5. Mathematics
6. The Arts (instead of a course in the arts, students can opt to study another science, individuals and societies, or language acquisition course)



The International Baccalaureate

As well as the six subject areas, students complete three core parts of the IB Diploma which are central to the philosophy of the programme. These are:

- Extended Essay (EE)
- Theory of Knowledge (TOK)
- Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)




Namibia Application Process

NAMIBIA APPLICATION PROCESS 2023

To apply, go to:

1. All Namibian students apply through the Namibian National Committee
2. Students complete application and submit necessary documentation before closing date
3. Student will be shortlisted based on merit and UWC selection criteria
4. Shortlisted students contacted for selection day (note: this may be virtual)
5. Successful students nominated to various UWC colleges/schools
6. UWC colleges/schools accept student nominations
7. Successful students receive formal offer from UWC school/college

Selection Criteria

We are looking for students who want to become change-makers for a better world, whatever their background. However, we are specifically looking for people with:

- Intellectual curiosity and motivation
- Active commitment
- Social competence
- Resilience, personal responsibility and integrity
- Motivation for UWC

In addition to the UWC selection criteria, the Namibian NC requires the below:

- Namibian citizen
- Aged 16-18 years
- History of academic excellence
- Completed grade 10 and is currently in grade 11 or grade 12

Key Dates for your application

- 20 January 2023: Applications open
- 20 February 2023: Applications close
- March: Students shortlisted and invited to attend selection day
- End March: Successful students nominated to schools/colleges
- April- May: Colleges/school send formal acceptance letters to successful students
- August: Students begin UWC experience (with the exception of UWC Waterford- which commences in Jan 2022)



Required supporting documentation

Ensure you attach clear copies of the below documentation as part of your application:

- 1) Proof of identification
- 2) Grade 9 and 10 academic transcripts
- 3) Academic reference letter
- 4) Non-academic reference letter
- 5) Financial Assessment Form
- 6) Parent/Guardian Consent Form
